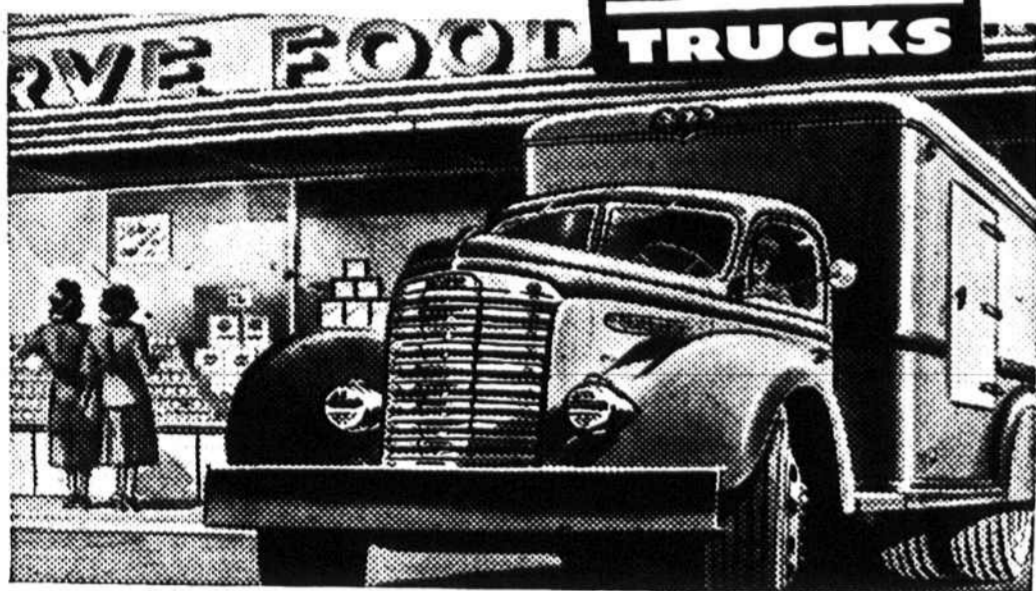

Dillard Overtakes Lee For Lead In Slugging Race

Ben Dillard, slugging third baseman of the Sylva Legionaires, replaced George Lee as the leader of his team's hitters by boosting his average 4 points to .379 as Lee fell to .366 by going hitless in three times at bat against Beacon Sunday. Jack (Lard) Cunningham gained 5 points to .366 and a tie with Lee for second place. Bob Phillips with .274 and Jim Cunningham with .273 round out the top five.

Dillard Still Big Gun In Specialized Depts.

The big name in the Sylva Legionaires' specialized hitting departments is still Ben Dillard. After another week of play, Dillard still paces the hitters in four departments and is tied for the lead in two others. Runs, hits, stolen bases and runs batted in are all gathered together under one hat and it fits Dillard. A 3-way tie for doubles is held by Dillard, Phillips and Jack Cunningham. Home runs are split between Dillard and Cunningham, and triples are split between Phillips and Duke.

In the pitchers' department Warren Deyermond has the most strikeouts with 36, while Deyermond, James Cunningham and Sumner are tied for walks issued with 11 each.
