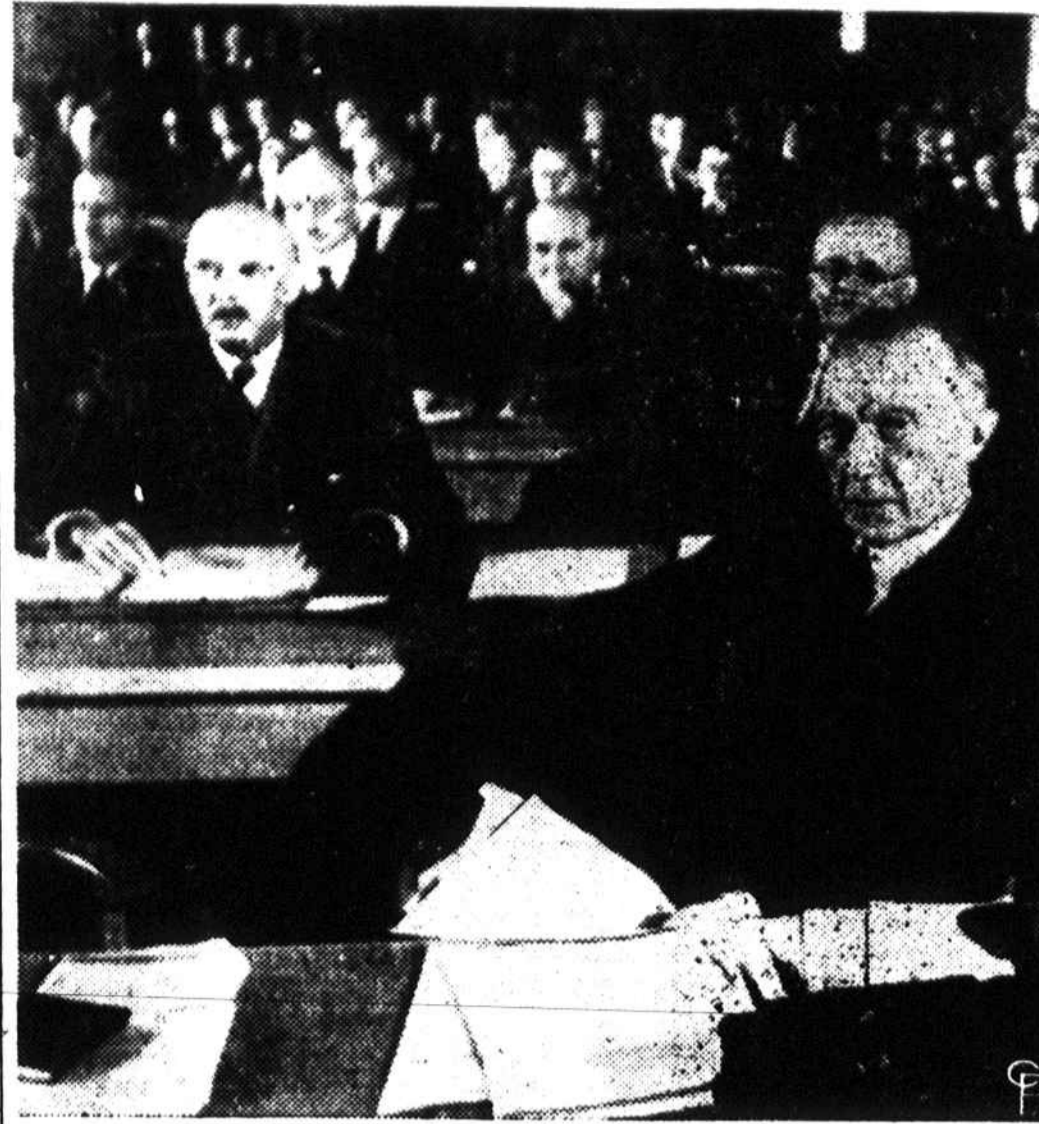

Hours: 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Court room.

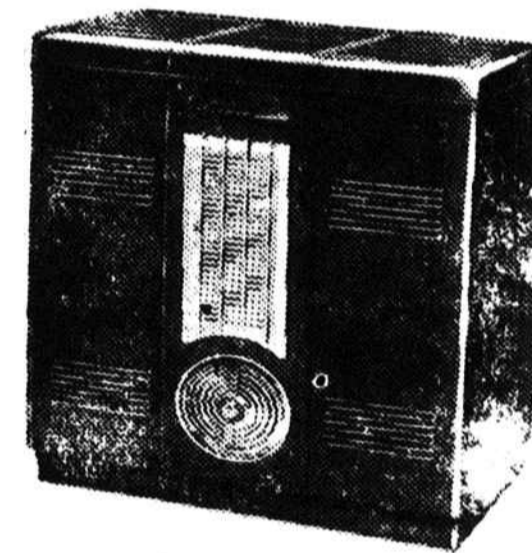
