

Oral Yates Names Regional Advisor In Book Campaign

Oral L. Yates has been named regional advisor of 15 counties for the collection of books and magazines to be shipped to Europe as part of an educational program of the peoples of Germany.

The program is sponsored by the North Carolina Department of Education, and plans are underway on a state-wide basis to collect books and magazines and ship to Germany to supplement their English school books.

A similar program was inaugurated in the state last year, and thousands of pounds of books and magazines were shipped overseas.
