JACKSON FARMERS BUILDING BETTER SOIL, LIVESTOCK

Farmers of Jackson County have over the past few years made substantial progress in building up the fertility of their soil by the use of lime, phosphate, potash and legumes. This has resulted in greatly increased yields per acre not only of the row crops, such as corn, but of the hay crops and pastures as well. The farmers by first raising the productivity of their soils are now in a position to realize more money through the sale of livestock and livestock products, since the increased home grown feed including good pastures allows more livestock to be kept and at a cheaper cost per animal. The quality of livestock has been greatly improved due to more and better feed as well as to more attention being given to breeding.

Jackson County now has some fine ladino clover and orchard grass pastures throughout the county. Farmers generally are building more and better pastures. Alfalfa acreage for hay has increased tremendously along with other good legumes and grass fields for hay. A number of farmers are in the process of expanding their dairy and poultry operations by going into Grade A milk production and the selling of hatching eggs. This all adds up to more and better livestock which in turn means more money from the farms of Jackson county.

The Tar Heel tobacco crop for 1949 is generally five to 15 days late in most areas.

Cigarette production in the United States for domestic use was up 5.3 per cent during the first quarter of 1949 as compared to the same period last year. Commercial exports, however, were down 40 per cent compared to last year.

Newcastle disease continues to be a menace to the poultry industry. The disease is serious and has spread widely and rapidly. It has been reported from every State.

LIMESTONE TESTS ARE MADE ON PIT IN SWAIN COUNTY

Bryson City—Tests conducted by state chemists reveal that the quality of limestone from the pit at Hewitts is of as high quality as that taken from the Mascot pit in Tennessee, it has been announced by the AAA here.

The officer said the tests were conducted on a blind basis and that the respective companies did not know that they were being made. Samples from each pit rated excellent, the announcement said.
