time appears to be in the Sheriff's and Representative's races. It looked as if there would be no contests in the Register's and Clerk's races, as far as the Democrats were concerned, until the last day for filing.

Incumbent Register of Deeds Glenn Hughes, a native of Jackson county, resident of Cullowhee, is seeking re-election against Gordon R. Jones, formerly of South Carolina, but a resident of Cashiers for a number of years. Mr. Jones has been caddie master of the High Hampton Golf course during the playing season.

Wood Smith, of Speedwell, first announced for Sheriff then pulled off and filed for Clerk of Court against John E. Henson, of Sylva, incumbent.

The primary election will be held on Saturday, May 27. The registration books will open Saturday, April 29, and remain open each Saturday until May 20.

ficer held by Smith.

Tolar's tenure of office, ironically, began and ended amid a storm of protest over his alleged traffic violations. He took office a week after being charged court costs for attempting to squelch a speeding charge by two Scotland Neck police officers. Tolar had acted as the Governor's chauffeur during Scott's 1948 gubernatorial campaign.

The ousted Tolar contended that attacks against him "have not been aimed at me personally but directed at the administration through me". He asserted that "three of the top Patrol officers who are opposed to the administration tried to get my job through political pull—and I have not been able to get their complete cooperation." Tolar declined to name the officers.

Major Smith, 44-year-old native of Wilmington, will be the first Patrol commander who has risen through all the ranks. He became a patrolman when the Patrol was organized in 1929. He was a sergeant from 1931-46, when he became a lieutenant and took command of Patrol Troop B in Fayetteville. He was made a captain a year later, and last May was promoted to major and made the Patrol's executive officer in Raleigh.
