Jackson County Democrats will of whiskey. again cast their ballot for nominee for a U.S. Senator in the 2nd primary to be held on Saturday. Graham is running as incumbent against Willis Smith, Raleigh Attorney. Graham was appointed to the Senate post 14 months ago by Governor Scott to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Senator J. Melville Broughton.

Smith called the second primary when Senator Graham failed to receive a clear majority (more than half of the total votes cast) in he regular primary May 27, where there were four candidates

In the record high vote on that date, Graham got 303,605 votes; Smith 250,222; Reynolds 58,752; and Olla Boyd, 5,900. Graham led of having a majority.

In the balloting in this county on May 27 Graham received 2249 votes; Smith, 1549, or 700 less than Graham; Bob Reynolds received 333 and Ollo Boyd 43 votes.



Brutal Crime

The bruised and battered body of Miss Taylor was found by a searching party about 9:30 Wednesday night, June 14, lying in a thicket of underbrush partly covered with rock and brush about 1-4 mile from her home and only about 150 yards from the home of her alleged murderer.
