Industry Teams Up With Farm Youth In 4-H Club Programs CHICAGO—(Special) Ten years ago only a handful of industrial concerns were supporting 4-H Club work nationally. Today—through the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work—nearly 50 industries, businessmen and women are backing up their faith in two million 4-H Club members with Guy L. Noble incentives valued at \$40,000 annually. This amount is distributed for awards and leader training funds in 4-H programs which range from canning to tractor maintenance.

"The money is considered a sound investment in the nation's future by encouraging these rural boys and girls who have pledged their head, heart, hands and health to make the best better," declared Guy L. Noble, director of the National 4-H Committee, a non-profit citizen's group.

"4-H youth learn by doing," he stated, "and guiding their efforts are 225,000 volunteer club leaders who work under the direction of the Extension Service of the State Agricultural colleges to carry out 4-H program objectives." The teenagers do a man-sized job in their projects, according to Noble, and by the time they reach 21 many are well on the way to becoming independent farmers, while others have substantial bank accounts.

STATE COLLEGE FARMER'S AID

QUESTION—I have twin calves, one a male and one a female. Will the female breed?

ANSWER—In about 10 cases out of 11, she would not be expected to breed, says J. A. Arey, in charge of dairy work for the State College Extension Service. It's a safe procedure, says Arey, to keep such heifers until they are old enough to breed. Then, if they are not fertile, the owner would not sustain any loss by selling them for beef.

QUESTION—What items should be included in a first aid kit for the farm home?

ANSWER—A first aid kit might well contain the following: rolls of adhesive tape of various widths, sterile cotton, swabs and sticks, sterile white cloth or bandages and tourniquets, tube of sterile white vaseline for minor burns, scissors, boric acid, tincture of benzoin, an accepted antiseptic, aromatic spirits of ammonia.

A good first aid kit need not be expensive or difficult to provide. A tight box, preferably metal, such as a cash box or a fishing tackle or even a tightly covered tin can, may be used. The box should be thoroughly cleaned and well labeled.
