ED SILVER

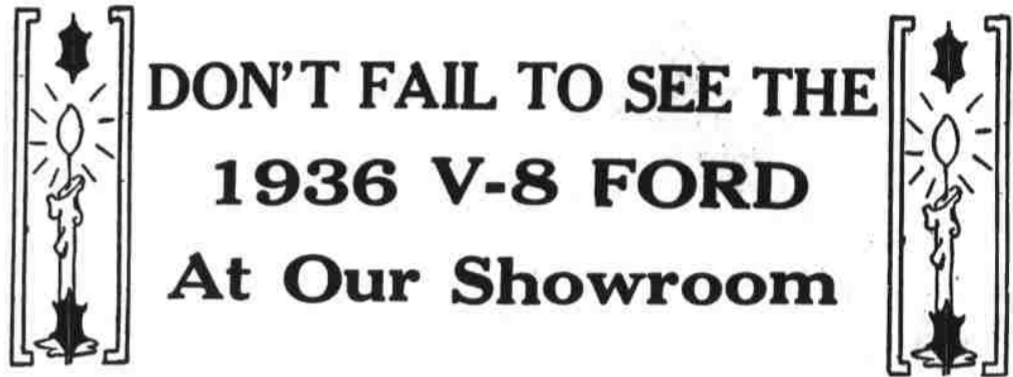
Application will be made to the
