Many disabled people who are not yet 50 years old are failing to "freeze" their social security records, according to Mrs. Lucille M. Rickman, field representative of the Social Security Administration.

Benefit payments are made to a severely disabled person and certain of his dependents if he is between 50 and 65 years old and PERMITS ARE has worked under social security during 5 of the 10 years before during 5 of the 10 years before he became disabled. Even though no benefits are payable to a disabled person who is under 50, it

By freezing his record a worker makes it possible to figure any future benefits on his average earnings up to the time that he became disabled. Also, by freezing his record a worker protects his right to benefits, which he might otherwise lose if he is disabled for a long time.
