Fort Jackson, S. C., — Pvt. Jeter C. Thomas, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Thomas of Hot Springs, N. C., has been assigned to Company C, 8th. Battalion, 2th. Training Regiment at Fort

Jackson, S. C., for eight weeks of Basic Combat Training.

Upon arrival at Fort Jackson, he was issued clothing and given a complete physical examination and a comprehensive battery of aptitude tests.

As part of his training he will be taught rifle marksmanship under the Army's new TRAIN-FIRE program. He will learn

to use an M-1 rifle by firing at pop-up targets at unknown distances on terrain which duplicates combat areas.

He will also be taught drill, tactics, bayonet and hand-to-hand combat, military courtesy, first-aid and other basic subjects. He will learn how to throw a grenade, fire in pitch darkness, crawl under barbed wire with machine gun fire overhead, and defend himself in simulated chemical, biological and radiological warfare situations.

During his seventh week of training, he will march 13 miles with full field pack, live in the field and learn to integrate the skills he has been taught.

After completing Basic Combat Training, he normally will receive a two-week leave before reporting for his next assignment.

Your Social Security

Many disabled people who are not yet 50 years old are failing to "freeze" their social security records, according to Mrs. Lucille M. Rickman, field representative of the Social Security Administration.

Benefit payments are made to a severely disabled person and certain of his dependents if he is between 50 and 65 years old and has worked under social security during 5 of the 10 years before he became disabled. Even though no benefits are payable to a disabled person who is under 50, it is very important that he file a claim now to freeze his record.

By freezing his record a worker makes it possible to figure any future benefits on his average earnings up to the time that he became disabled. Also, by freezing his record a worker protects his right to benefits, which he might otherwise lose if he is disabled for a long time.

To freeze his record a disabled person must file an application with his social security office, at which time he will be given forms for his physician to complete. "The important thing to remember," Mrs. Rickman concluded, "is get in touch with your social security office right away if you've been disabled several months and it appears you will not be able to return to work soon—provided you have worked at least 5 years under the program. If you wait too long, it may be too late to qualify."

Mrs. Rickman is in the Court House in Marshall the first and third Tuesdays of each month to give assistance and information to Madison County residents on social security matters.

BRUSH BURNING PERMITS ARE NOW ESSENTIAL

J. Moody Chandler, Madison County Forest Ranger, announced this week that brush-burning permits are essential and urged everyone in Madison County to read the following law and secure permits at once:

Brush-Burning Permit Law:
14-139. Starting fires within five hundred feet of areas under protection of State Forestry service. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to start or cause to be started any fire or ignite any material in any of the areas of woodlands under the protection of the State Forest service or within five hundred (500) feet of any such protected area, during the hours starting at midnight and ending at 4:00 p. m., without first obtaining from the State Forester or one of his duly authorized agents a permit to start or cause to be started any fire or ignite any material in such above mentioned between the first day of October and the first day of June inclusive. No charge shall be made for the granting of said permits.

During periods of hazardous forest fires conditions the State Forester is authorized to cancel all permits and prohibit the starting of any fires in any of the woodlands under the protection of the State Forest service or within five hundred (500) feet of any such protected area.

This Section shall not apply to any fires started or caused to be started within one hundred (100) feet of an occupied dwelling house.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisoned for a period of not more than thirty (30) days. (Chapter 14-139, General Statutes of N. C. Public Laws of 1953 Session.)
