The ROAD concept was developed to meet the need for greater flexibility and combat power in modern Army divisions.

The 23-year-old soldier attended Unicoi County High School in Erwin.

Three weeks are devoted to the rifle range, where recruits fire the M-14 rifle and receive instruction in other basic Marine infantry weapons.

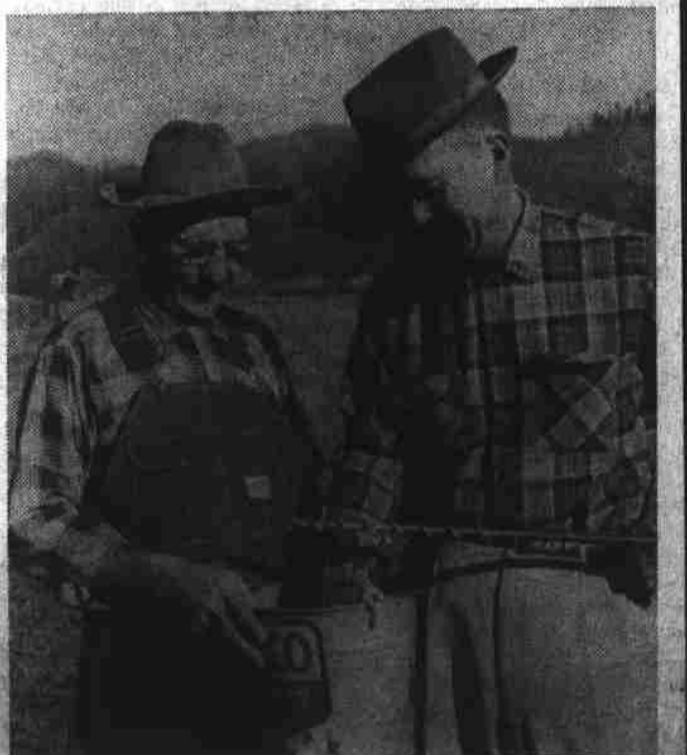

**How I Raised
My Best Crop
Of Burley Tobacco**

"I WAS getting good tobacco yields but decided last year to see if the Agrico Program could make them better," says Claude J. Wild of Rte. 4, Marshall (Madison Co.), N. C. "When my Agrico Soil Test Report came back, I followed the fertilizer recommendations as closely as possible, using 1,200 lbs. of Agrico for Tobacco 3-9-9 per acre along on the row on half the field. For comparison, I followed my usual program on the rest of the field.
