In a release from Pusan, Korea, it is reported that Korean youngsters in the Pusan area discovered recently that they have "relatives" they hadn't known about.

Their unknown "relatives" appeared last month in the role of "Big Brothers" - U. S. soldiers who visit orphans and schools and in turn invite the children to their compounds for American games "What we really have in mind

is a cultural and social exchange on a people-to-people basis," explained Pfc. Virgil Smith, of Marshall, who is stationed in Korea. Pfc. Smith is president of the Enlisted Men's Activities Council (EMAC) of the Idle Hour Service Club, sponsors of the project.

Smith said, " we are trying to encourage the soldiers to spend more time with the children in orphanages." He points out that a friendly game of handball or soccer is most important in establishing better understanding of the children and the U.S. soldier.
