The affidavit sworn to by Freeman and Snelson said the meeting was called for 10 a. m., on April 11, to accommodate Jack Guthrie, the Republican member, who wanted to attend a ball game in Asheville, and Snelson, who wanted to go to the Dan Moore cattle sale in Asheville.

They said they discussed waiting a few more minutes to see if a list would show up, but Freeman said Democrats had no list and "it was agreed unanimously that the meeting would continue and the officials for the ensuing two years would be named in the absence of a list from either the Republican or Democratic chairman."

harmonious, with only two differences of opinion in 69 names, and that the meeting had adjourned when Freeman received the telephone call from Mrs. Gosnell.

The affidavit quoted Briggs as saying he had been delayed by business and by a highway patrolman, and that Freeman told him the board was not responsible for his personal business or for notifying him of the meeting.

The Freeman-Snelson affidavit concluded by saying allegations that the board named precinct officials under age or with criminal records were false.

The three affidavits were sworn before Superior Court Clerk Herbert Hawkins.

State Board Chairman William Joslin said meanwhile, "we are going to look into it to see if there appears to be any serious violations of the law." Joslin said the law required the meeting to be held in public.

But, he added, even if Briggs had made his recommendations to the board in time, "I don't think it would have made any difference." Joslin said the law does not require boards to name precinct officials from lists submitted by party chairmen.

The law says the county board may appoint from such lists but does not say the board "must" appoint from them, Joslin said.

started an intensive management program on his woodland in 1964. He had 117 acres of woodland at that time, today he has 181 acres of woodland; which has a growth rate of 397 board feet per acre per year and it is expected to increase appreciably in the near future.

Mr. Fred Tilson, who has 75 acres also in the Grapevine Community and who also set up an intensive management program in 1944, has 53 acres of woodland of which is averaging 515 board feet per acre per year. Madison County is proud of both of these men and the fine job they are doing in showing people in Western North Carolina that money can be made in woodland.

I would like to point out that just four of these awards have been given in the history of this program and two of these are in Madison County, which is only proper, because there is great potential in forestry and forest products in Madison County.

fied to represent the Madison County Republican party." Briggs charged in the protest that some of the election officials appointed, both Democrats and Republicans, hold public office, some work for the county or state, some have criminal records, and that at least one is under age.

Briggs' protest contends that "it is apparent from the kind of precinct officials who have been appointed, with their present employment by the state and county and their close friendship to other public officials and candidates, that it will be difficult, if not impossible, to secure a fair election

in Madison County, particularly since there is no representative of the minority party who was recommended by its county chairman; "That the present Board of Elections acted arbitrarily and in bad faith and in a deliberate effort to prevent the minority party from having local members to act as its officials; "That free elections cannot long prevail in this state if they are conducted by one party as they are in dictatorships, and here in Madison County there is clear evidence of a one party domination through evil use of the election laws."

Concluding his protest, Briggs asks "that an investigation of said meeting and appointments be conducted, and if this investigation reveals that the Board of Elections acted arbitrarily and in bad faith, that the (board) be replaced by persons who will perform their duties according to law; "That in the event the board members are not replaced, that said board be directed to reconvene and appoint election officials as the law provides; "That, in any event, proper measures be taken to insure and safeguard fair and honest elections in Madison County in keeping with the spirit and intent of the law."
