### ISSUANCE OF TOBACCO CARDS WILL BE BY MAIL

Marketing cards which farm operators will use in accounting for the disposition made of this year's tobacco production will be issued through the mail, according to announcement by Ralph Ramsey, Office Manager for Madison County ASCS.

Ramsey said that warehouses will open to receive tobacco on November 20 and that marketing cards will be mailed to farm operators on or near November 17 in order that they may have them for use in placing tobacco on warehouse floors prior to November 20 will not be eligible for price support and that marketing cards must be presented to the warehouse representative when it is weighed in so as to identify it as being eligible for support and for recording the marketing card serial number on the floor sheet.

of sales slips and that such farm carries only five memorandums usually make more than five sales on their crop. Other farmers who need additional memorandums may secure an additional card after all are used from the first one by calling at the County Office.

In conclusion, Ramsey urged all farm operators to comply with each item listed on the back of the cards and to return them to the ASCS Office after all sales for the farm have been completed.
