Use Of Typewriter In Filing Income Returns Preferred

However, Mr. Wall emphasized that handwritten returns will be accepted by Internal Revenue if typing cannot be employed.

He said the Social Security Administration will use an "Optical Character Recognition" machine to 'read" the Schedule A of Form 941 and related continuation sheets and enter the information directly into its electronic data processing system for maintaining social security records.

The machine cannot read colored inks, handwriting, or handprinting. Hence, the Administration has requested that machine typing be employed if possible.

Complete instructions are included in the Form 941 package mailed to employers.
