Roscoe Lankford, Native Of County, Dies In Kentucky

Roscoe J. Lankford, 77, a retired Kentucky coal company official who was born in Madison County, died Tuesday, February 2, 1964 in Middlesboro, Ky., after a long illness.

He was a son of the late John Jacob and Delilah Temple Lankford of Hot Springs.

He attended Dorland Institute and Draughan's Business College in Knoxville, and spent 41 years with the Clear Fork Coal Co., in Fonde, Ky., rising from clerk to president before he retired in 1951.

Surviving are three brothers, Vern and Edd Lankford of Hot Springs, and Clifford Lankford of Morristown, Tenn., and a sister, Mrs. Carrie Forrester of Hot Springs.

Services were held at 10 a. m., today (Thursday) at First Baptist Church in Middlesboro, Ky. Burial was in Alder Branch Cemetery, Sevierville, Tenn. Sunset Funeral Home of Middlesboro was in charge.

With Our Boys In Service

USS Sylvania (AFS-2) (FHT-NC) — Radioman Second Class Johnny Rigby, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Rigby of Rt. 5, Marshall, is serving aboard the combat stores ship USS Sylvania, operating out of Norfolk, Va.

The Sylvania is the Navy's newest underway replenishment ship, designed to re-supply ships of the fleet at sea with fresh, frozen and dry provisions, general stores and aviation spare parts.

In addition to having the most modern design of trolley highlines to transfer her stores, Sylvania is also equipped with a flight deck, a helicopter hangar, and two Boeing Ch-46 "Sea Knight" helicopters, capable of making replenishment transfers by air.

The ship is scheduled to deploy to the U. S. Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean this spring. Crewmembers of the ship will have the opportunity of visiting Spanish, French and Italian ports while with the Sixth Fleet.
