4-H Council Met At REA Building; Training Cited

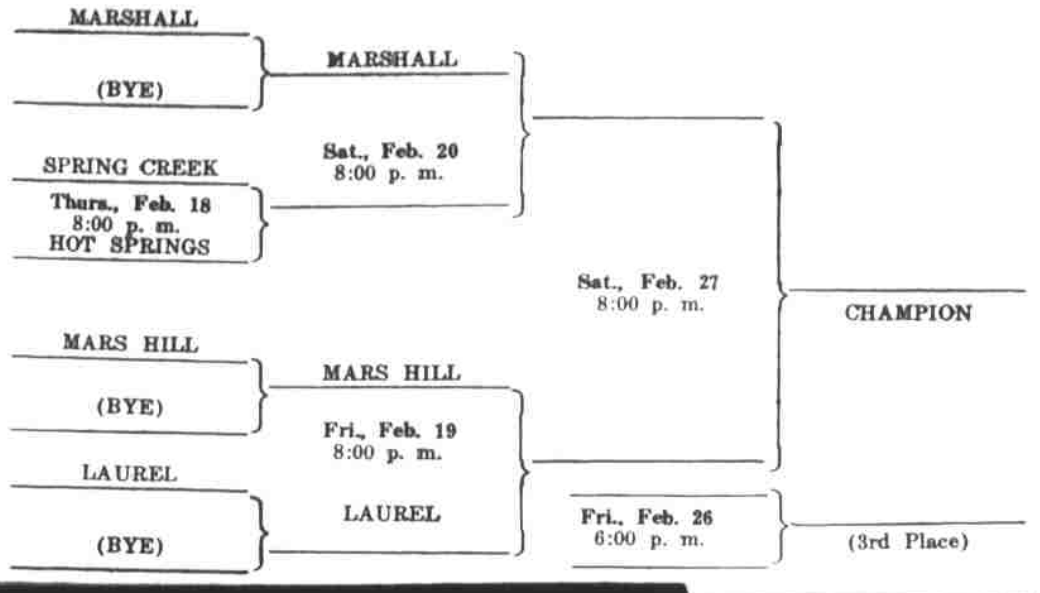
