First Tract: All that piece or parcel of land lying and being in the Town of Hot Springs, No. 9 Township, Madison County, North Carolina, being bounded on the North by Serpentine Avenue, on the East by Mrs. Joy Gayer and Ella Mae Barnes, on the South by G. 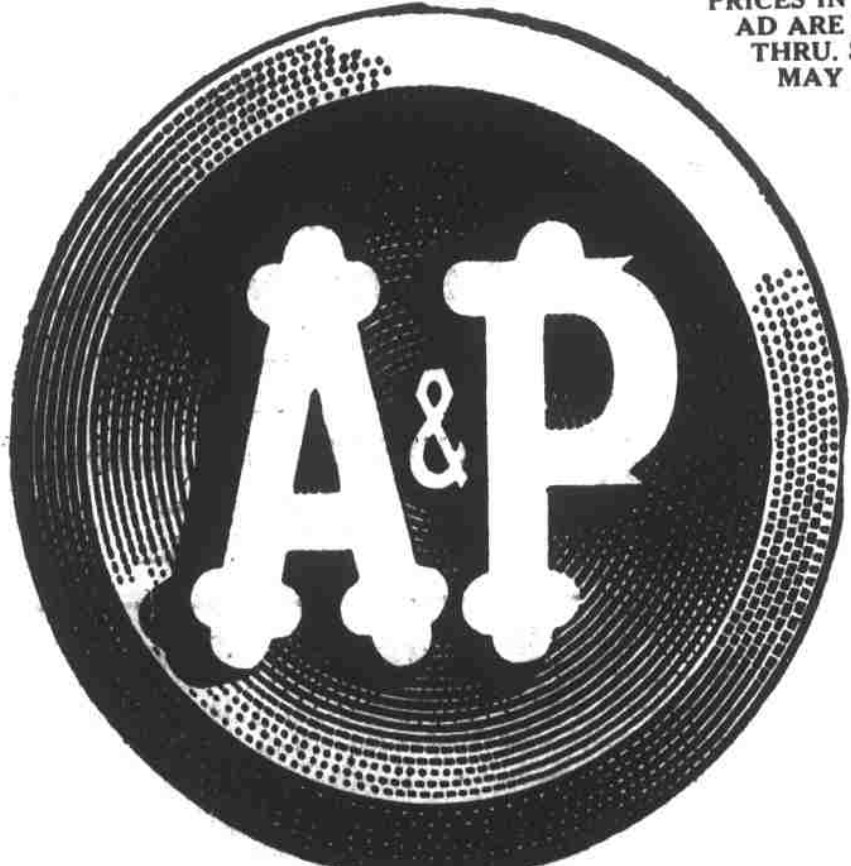
