

International Sunday School Lesson for NOVEMBER 2, 1969

GOD'S JUDGMENT OF JUDAH

Memory Selection: "Therefore now amend your ways and your doings, and obey the voice of the Lord your God; and the Lord will repent him of the evil that he hath pronounced against you." (Jeremiah 26:13)

Lesson Text: Jeremiah 7; 26; 52.

The central truth of this lesson is that disobedience to God's ordinances inevitably ends in both

personal and national decay, and national disaster.

If we are in any doubt on this score, we have only to reflect on the story of the downfall of Judah, as depicted so graphically for us in the Book of Jeremiah. Indeed, in our own day and time we have witnessed in very recent years the downfall of hitherto great nations who went against Christian principles and beliefs.

Judah would not live according to God's laws; neither would she heed the warnings that Jeremiah, at God's bidding, gave to her on more than one occasion.

Judah had suffered spiritually under the regime of King Zedekiah; idolatry was rampant, and the people only gave lip-service to the Lord in His Temple. They shirked the discipline the Christian life would impose upon them. They ignored the fact that while they went through the notions of worship — God knew what was truly in their hearts.

Thus it was that Jeremiah refused Zedekiah's command to intercede for Judah, for the (Jeremiah) believed that Judah had sinned too long to escape the fate that was in

store for her. And for this refusal, he was imprisoned and exiled.

Are we ourselves, entirely innocent of the sins of the Judahs? Are we not equally guilty with them in some of our attitudes? Our idols may just be different — wealth, position, our comfort and ease! The broad, wide avenue of spiritual laxity is so much easier to travel than the thorny path of self-discipline and truth that God would have us tread!

We are prone to take undue advantage of our fellow-men, and we, too, are sometimes blind to the fact that, although God's punishments are sometimes seemingly exceedingly harsh, they are always intended, in love, to have a redemptive purpose. The crosses we may be asked to bear will invariably strengthen our spiritual awareness and discipline our souls.

We, in this day and time, are equally in need of responsible God-motivated leaders... not hypocrites or rabble-rousers — but Christian-oriented men who have the courage to speak out and call us to order.

We need to repent. We need

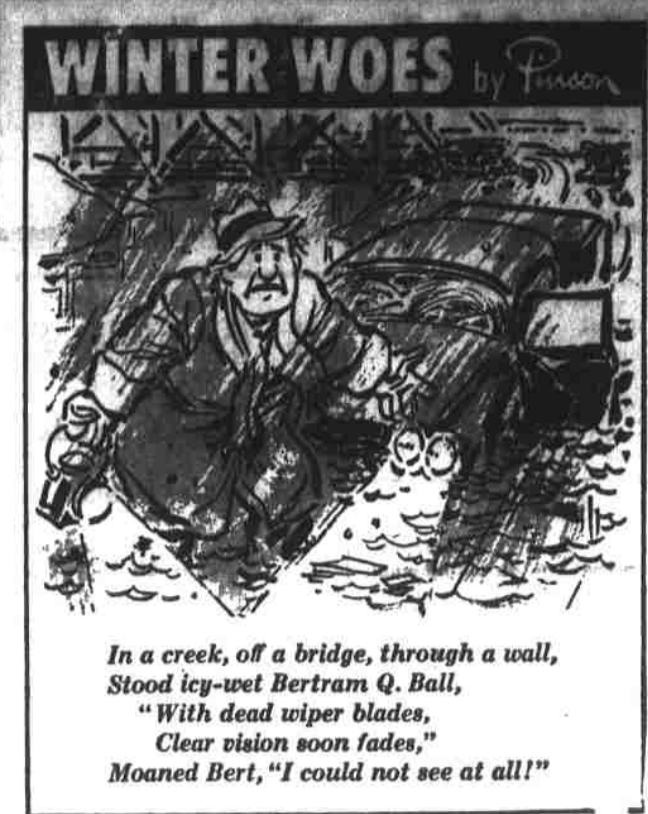

gether a number of time and decided to organize a tomato growers association. Representatives from this county and from Haywood, Buncombe, Mitchell and Macon counties met in Asheville to discuss the possibilities of organizing a North Carolina Tomato Growers Association. This group of tomato producers from these counties organized and received a charter. (North Carolina Trellised Tomato Growers Association, Inc.) Madison County is represented in this organization with two on the Board of Directors. Don Edwards from Madison County is the president of the North Carolina Trellised Growers Association. N. T. Flemmons from Buncombe County is the secretary and E. B. Rickman from Haywood County is the vice president.

An effort is being made to have as large participation as possible throughout Western North Carolina from tomato growers to belong to and support the North Carolina Trellised Tomato Growers Association, Inc. Membership in this organization constitutes membership in the local organization. North Carolina has nine other including the apple growers, the fruit and vegetable associations blueberry growers, the grape growers, the yam growers, and others. Representatives from each of these groups and the North Carolina Trellised Tomato Growers Association recently met in Raleigh and organized the North Carolina Horticultural organization representing all the major fruit and vegetable organizations. The primary purpose of a tomato growers association is to promote and develop the trellised tomato industry. This includes research on breeding, growing, and disease control and any other activity which will promote the betterment of tomato production and marketing. A meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, November 5 for all tomato growers in Madison County. The meeting will be held in the Courthouse at 7:00 p. m. A discussion and explanation on the North Carolina Trellised Tomato Growers Association, Inc., will be held.
