With this new center all of the seven numbers must be dialed before reaching the party being called.

When dialing someone on your own party line, dial the complete directory number; after you have dialed the seven numbers, you will receive a recording telling you to hang up, wait approximately five seconds, pick up and wait for the party to answer.

Also, in the past, customers had to dial the operator to receive directory information, with this new center just dial 411 for information.
