# Governor Calls For Voluntary Gas Rationing

Gov. Jim Holshouser urged North Carolina motorists and gasoline dealers Sunday night to accept specific voluntary measures, including an Oregon-style odd-even distribution plan, as a means of easing the state's gasoline shortage.

Holshouser, appearing on statewide television, asked motorists to cooperate, on a completely voluntary basis, in a system in which cars with license tags ending in an odd number will get gasoline on Monday, Wednesday and Friday only.

Cars with license plates ending in an even number would get gasoline on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday only.

Those cars with special license plates that do not end in a number will be considered in the odd-Monday, Wednesday, Friday category. Other major requests by Holshouser were: -That motorists wait until their gas tanks are half full or

less before pulling into a service station to buy more.

-That service station operators increase the limit on gasoline sales, so that hopefully a driver could get up to 10 gallons, at least.

-That service station operators split their weekly gasoline supply six ways so stations can be open and pumping gas six days a week, Monday through Saturday.

-That service stations split their daily supply into two halves so they can be pumping gas in the late afternoon as well as in the morning.

-And that service stations post on their pumps or doors a schedule of their pumping hours and fly a green flag when they are pumping.

While emphasizing that the program is entirely voluntary Holshouser noted that legislation is pending in the General Assembly that would give the governor broad emergency powers to fight the energy shortage. And, he said if the legislature approves, he won't hesitate to use the emergency powers if it becomes absolutely necessary.

The governor currently has

no authority to impose mandatory controls.

"There will be those who will say this plan doesn't go far enough," Holshouser said. "There will be those who will say that government should establish more rules and force people to abide by them.

"Maybe we will have to do that farther down the road. If the General Assembly gives the governor emergency powers to deal with the fuel shortage, I won't hesitate to use them if that becomes absolutely necessary," Holshouser said.

"We may even see the time when the federal government imposes coupon rationing."

In addition to the major

steps outlined, Holshouser, also renewed his plea that

residents organize car pools for their traveling. He urged that motorists make a special effort to cut their driving mileage by 25 per cent from what it was last year. And, he urged residents to take vacations within North Carolina this summer.
