

Any individual who willfully makes and subscribes an abstract listing required by this Subchapter which he does not believe to be true and correct as to every material matter shall be guilty of a misdeameanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. (1939, c. 310, s. 902; 1971, c. 806, s. 1.)
