**G.S. 105-310. AFFIRMATION: PENALTY FOR FALSE AFFIRMATION**

Any individual who willfully makes and subscribes an abstract listing required by this Subchapter which he does not believe to be true and correct as to every material matter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. (1969, c. 310, s. 302; 1971, c. 806, s. 1.)

### NOTICE FOR ELDERLY PERSONS APPLYING FOR \$5,000. EXEMPTION

"PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR ELDERLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED PERSONS WITH LIMITED INCOME."

If you are 65 years of age or older or totally and permanently disabled and your disposable income for the preceding year did not exceed seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.), you are eligible for an exclusion of up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.) in assessed value of the property you own and occupy as your principal residence. If you are qualified and wish to apply for this exclusion, there are "T" in boxes on the right.

Applications must fill out forms which will be furnished by the Tax Taker.

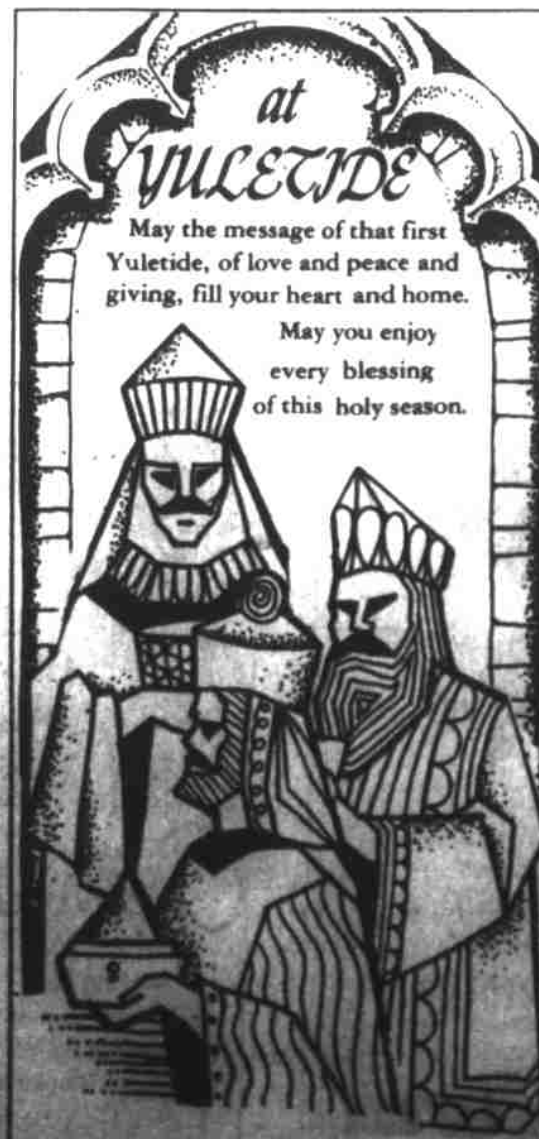

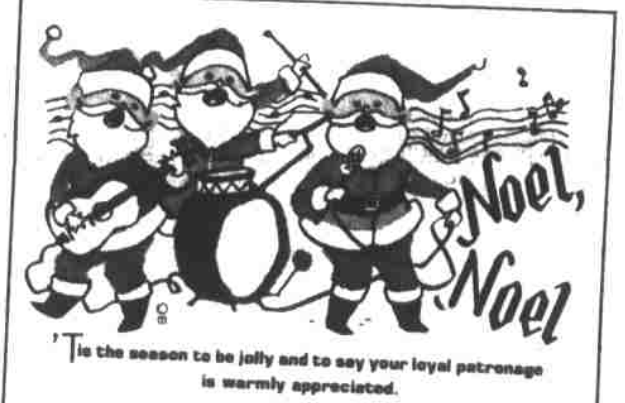

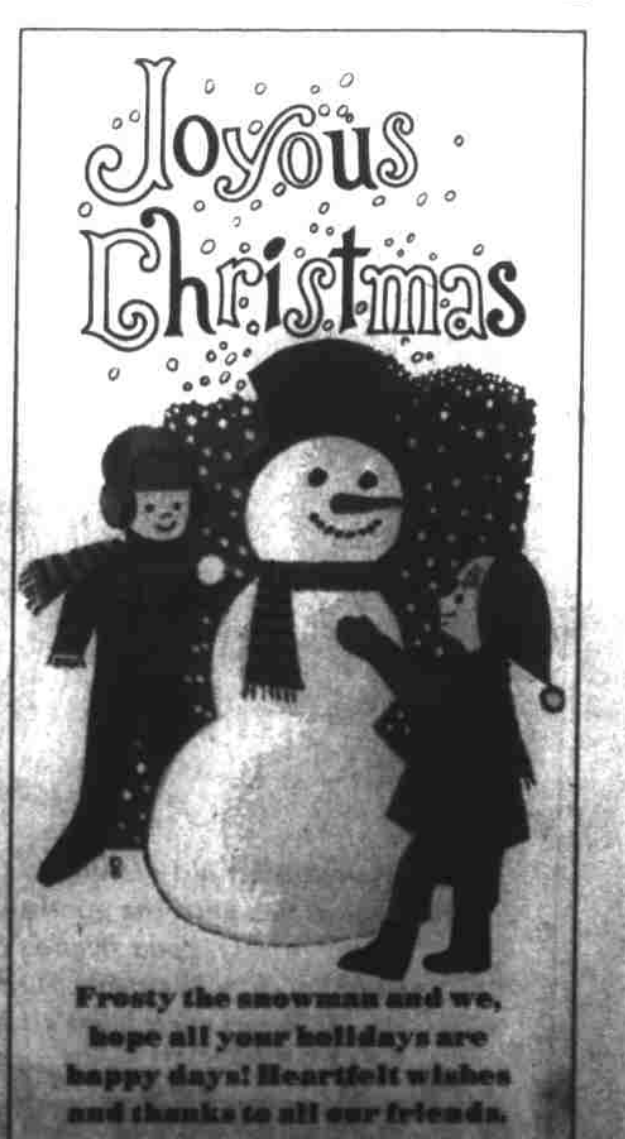
