

# Pisgah Teams Win MAC Tournament Here

The Pisgah high school boys on girls won the Mountain Athletic Conference Tournament championships on the

Madison floor last Saturday night but the main topic of conversation among basketball fans in this area

was the fine showing of the Madison high girls in advancing to the finals and almost defeating the Pisgah

girls. Led by Donna Davis, who scored 19 points and played an excellent defensive game, the Patriots almost upset the favored Pisgah team in the final quarter only to lose by three points, 53-49. Had it not been for a cold streak in the second quarter when Pisgah outscored the Pats, 22-9, and for some erratic passes and turnovers, the local girls coached by F.N. Willett, might have been Tourney champions.

The Madison girls earned their trip to the finals by defeating the Heritage girls Tuesday night, 60-43 and showed they were "for real" by upsetting favored Sylva-Webster 46-39 on Friday night.

The Madison Patriots were eliminated on Wednesday night by Tuscola when the local quint was defeated 64-57. Tuscola rallied from a 20-18 deficit at intermission to edge Madison High, 64-57, as Hank

Thompson pumped in 26 points for the winning Mountaineers. Mike Holt added 20 points for Tuscola. Danny Boone paced Madison with 16 points while Ricky Anderson added 14 and Harrell Wood 12. Tuscola broke open the tight game with five unanswered points with only three minutes remaining.

In the JV game Tuesday, Pisgah toppled Madison, 67-56. Joe Walker scored a game-high 24 points for the Madison Jayvees.

Tuscola defeated the Pisgah Jayvees, 60-53, for the Jayvee Championship Saturday night.

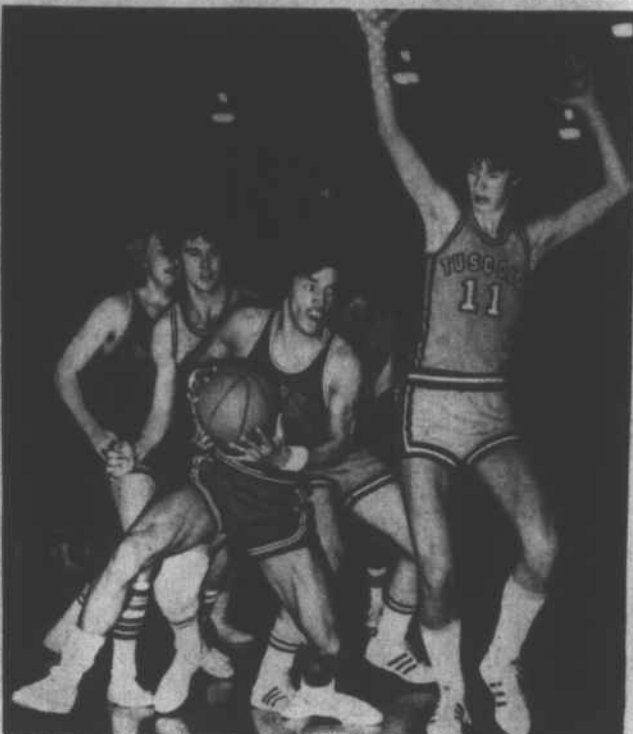
