These four events help demonstrate the diversity of Mountain Heritage Day, and support its claim as "a day full of music, crafts, exhibits, dancing, food and fun for the whole family."

The black powder muzzle-loading shoot, co-sponsored by the Jackson County Shooting Club, will include 10 five-shot matches, eight of them for open-sight, flint-percussion rifles.

There will be offhand matches at 25 and 50 yards, benchrest matches at 50 and 100 yards, ladies' matches at 25 and 50 yards, and two novelty matches at 50 yards. Two pistol matches also are planned, one at 25 yards and one at 50 yards.

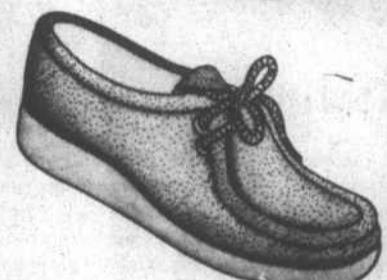
