Amory Lovins To Speak In Asheville

"An Energy Future We Can Live With" is the title of the program at UNC-Asheville Oct. 19-20, featuring Amory B. Lovins, the young physicist who is considered one of the most influential experts on energy in the world. Lovin is consultant physicist for Friends of the Earth, The International Federation of Institutes for Advanced Study, the Science Council of Canada, the U.S. Office of Technology Assessment, and several U.N. agencies.

His view on the answers to our future energy needs are of interest to all those who feel we must make the transition to a safer and more economically sound energy path.

In 1977, Lovins published a book entitled Soft Energy Paths. His view is that "soft energy" (such as solar heating, power from renewable resources, and fuel from biomass alcohol) will provide more reasonable, safe and economical answers to our energy needs than "hard technologies" such as nuclear power, which can create more problems than they solve.

Mr. Lovins will lecture on Oct. 19 at 8 p.m. on "Soft Energy Paths" at Lipinsky Auditorium, U.N.C.A. On Oct. 20 at 9 a.m. he will give a seminar on energy goals in the Humanities building.

This extraordinary opportunity to listen to and question Mr. Lovins should be of special interest to Madison County residents. Our own French Broad EMC is exploring ways in which to use the resources of our area in safe, economical ways to produce energy for our area. Mr. Lovins, described as a "persuasive prodigy of soft energy and advocate of private initiative" "would certainly agree with our EMC's goals.

The program is sponsored by UNC-Asheville, Carolinians for Safe Energy, The Sierra Club, American Association of University Women, and the Asheville-Buncombe League of Women Voters.
