For something over \$400,000 from the state Department of Transportation's highway fund, the road will be virtually re-made - curves straightened, hills smoothed, surface paved. In some places the road is only 8 to 10 feet wide; it will be broadened to a uniform width of 18 feet.

The right-of-way problems that have delayed the work have been solved, and the 47 families living along the Cutshalltown Road could have a modern highway by as early as this summer.


