Sixty-three percent of this year's seniors have applied to college compared to 55 percent of the Class of 1983. At the time we took the survey in April, 52 seniors reported being accepted in a college. Many others have received acceptance letters since the survey was taken.

At least 12 seniors have received scholarships to college, including Norman Groce of Mars Hill, who became Madison High School's third Morehead Scholarship winner.

In addition to college, 11 seniors reported they are planning to get married following graduation and another 20 reported they plan to go right to work.


