Wet Spring Slows Crops

The extended period of wet weather in April and May has caused much hardship for Madison County farmers. They have been unable to complete land preparation for spring crops. Early-seeded tobacco plant beds are becoming too large, and some have

been mowed back in order to prolong the time when they can be transplanted. Many of the later-seeded beds have experienced growth problems because of too much water and cold nights.

Dairymen are running behind in the planting of silage corn. Very little corn had been planted before last week.

Tomato growers are behind schedule, too. Growers in the Hot Springs area have a few plants in the ground, but these growers had some anxious moments during frosts of the previous week.

Some of the beating rains of the last two months have made farmers more aware of the need for conservation

practices to prevent soil erosion. Strip cropping on steep hillsides could slow down much of this erosion.

One bright spot has been the growth of pasture and hay-crop grasses. Ground water levels should be recovering from the drought of last summer.
