ATTENTION TOBACCO FARMERS

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The Hot Springs Health Program is a community based, non-profit corporation formed in April, 1971 to provide out patient and home based primary medical services for the residents of central and western Madison county. Dental services are offered at the Hot Springs office. Services are provided through three medical offices and visits (anywhere in Madison County) to homebound patients, utilizing the services of specially trained health care professionals; including a Family Practitioner, and Internist, a Pediatrician, a Family Nurse Practitioner, a Physician's Assistant, a Pharmacist, Registered Nurses and Clinical Assistants, in the pharmacy, radiography and laboratory.

The Hot Springs Health Program operates three modern medical facilities: **Marshall-Walnut Medical Center** (purchased and renovated in 1978), **Laurel Medical Center** (built in 1980), and **Hot Springs Medical and Dental Center** (built in 1983).

The Hot Springs Health Program operates a "fee-for-service" practice and fees are set to cover expenses. A special grant award allows the Program to reduce the fees charged for patients who are unable to afford the full fee for service. To be eligible for discount payment, proof of income is required. Third party reimbursement from Medicare, Medicaid, Workman's Comp, and private carriers are accepted.

The Program offers a comprehensive range of primary care service, with referrals for specialty care when it is needed. Services include:

- Health assessment, diagnosis and treatment for children and adults
- Emergency care
- Comprehensive dental care
- Pharmaceuticals
- In house laboratory services
- In house radiography service (x-ray)
- Health education

The following Home Health services are provided directly or by contracting with other local providers:

- Skilled nursing care
- Home health aide services
- Physical therapy services
- Occupational therapy services
- Speech therapy services
- Medical Social work
- Life Line
- Supportive care for the developmentally disabled

In the event that medical assistance is needed when the offices are closed assistance is still available. Patients can call an answering service and be directed to the practitioner on call for the day. The provider will discuss the problem by telephone and suggest a course of action to the patient; this may include instructions for care at home, meeting the patient at one of the medical centers or directing the patient to the emergency room depending on the nature of the problem.
