Banks To Head MS Drive

Neil Tomblay, the Greater Marshall Multiple Sclerosis Society, is currently organizing an Easter MS Drive. The drive will focus on the spiritual and physical needs for the fight against MS in Madison County. Multiple sclerosis is a neurological disease affecting the brain and spinal cord. It is not contagious nor is it a mental disease. It has been called the "mysterious crippler of young adults" because it is usually first diagnosed between the ages of 15 and 50.

Technically, the disease attacks the myelin sheathing of the central nervous system, destroying it in patches. The myelin sheath acts much like the insulation around telephone wires, and when it is destroyed, the flow of nerve impulses to and from the brain is interrupted or distorted.

The resultant symptoms from this destruction of myelin can be: paralysis, double vision, bladder or bowel problems, loss of balance, loss of coordination, and speech and hearing difficulties, among others. There are more than 500,000 people in America with MS.
