TAKING LIBERTY LOAN BONDS IN TRADE

I hope that the merchants of the country upon a more careful consideration of the subject, will discontinue their efforts to sell merchandise and take Liberty Loan Bonds in payment.

The Secretary states that he has no doubt that merchants offering to take Liberty Loan Bonds in exchange for merchandise are actuated by patriotic motives, but that such transactions tend to defeat a primary object of the bond sales as they discourage thrift and increase expenditures.

Applications for Government insurance in February 1918. Intensive efforts are being made by commanding officers to have all their men take insurance before that date.

Over 1400 cases of communicable diseases exist in North Carolina this month, according to the epidemiology map kept in the office of the State epidemiologist, Dr. A. McR. Crouch.

Counties reporting many cases of communicable diseases are not looked upon as being more afflicted or unhealthy than other counties, explains Dr. Crouch, but rather as doing good reporting and carrying out the terms of the law.
