CAMPBELL HURT IN AUTO WRECK. Peculiar Chain of Accidents to Buie's Creek Students and President. Seven hours after twelve-year-old Lillian Ferrell had accidentally shot and killed Allen Swaim, Winston-Salem student of Buie's Creek Academy, at Buie's Creek, G. S. Ferrell, Superintendent of the school, drove his Hudson Super six into a Ford Sedan four miles from Raleigh, injuring all its passengers, including Prof. J. A. Campbell, head of Buie's Creek Academy and five students who were accompanying the remains of young Swaim to Raleigh. Mr. Ferrell, more or less injured himself, was not told of the fatality in his own home and continued on his way to Buie's Creek from the scene of the accident in another car.

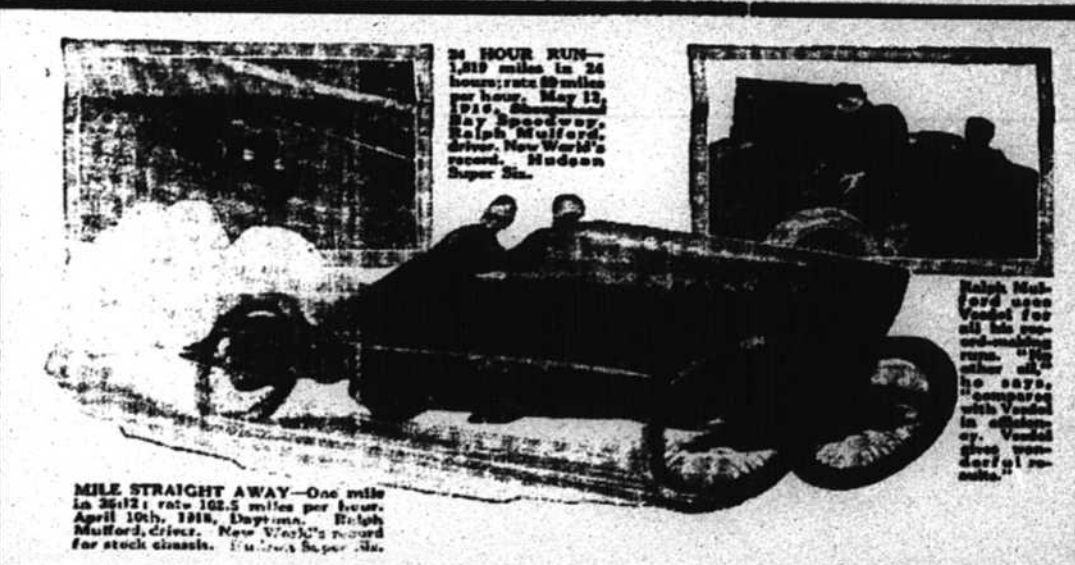
