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Gardens and truck patches in and around Dunn will yield a handsome income to their owners this spring and summer of plants under consideration by the Chamber of Commerce.

Canning is an industry through which the entire community would benefit. Tomatoes, beans, peas and other vegetables and fruits that grow in such abundance throughout the Dunn District can be conserved where thousands of dollars worth have been thrown away in former years.

Secretary Riddle is planning to have a representative of the home demonstration department of the state government at Dunn some time in the near future and explain just how the plans for conserving food is worked. The initial cost of installing necessary machinery will be small and it is estimated that the profits will be large.

Dunn merchants generally are disappointed to treat their debtors as leniently as circumstances will allow, but, according to Mr. D. Holliday, of the Barnes & Holliday company, they will have little sympathy for the fellows whose notes and accounts are long past due and refuse to visit them for the satisfactory rearrangement of such obligations.

The merchants expect to get little cash on accounts overdue, but they are determined to clean up all old notes. A past due note is a most unwelcome possession. Merchants are asking that they be retired. There is justice in this request. They will hesitate to foreclose on any person, but unless they are treated fairly no one can blame them for foreclosing. Any of us who can should retire obligations as they become due. Those who cannot should hasten to make satisfactory arrangements.

Properly cannot return to the community until the spirit of mutual helpfulness permeates the citizenship. If we are able to pay and will not pay just debts we are preventing some other fellow who has a better disposition settling his obligations. When we pay the other fellow can pay. Eventually the money goes the rounds of "butcher, baker, candlestick maker" etc. Finally it may find its way back to us. There is a whole lot of money in the community. It would relieve the situation if those who have it would start it in motion.
