AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF WATER BONDS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Dunn, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. That the Town of Dunn, pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, issue its bonds for the purpose of enlarging its existing water works system.

Section 2. That the maximum aggregate amount of said bonds shall be \$22,000.00.

Section 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the Clerk, pursuant to said act and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. That the assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the municipality for the fiscal year 1920, as shown by said statement, is \$4,546,112.00.

Section 6. That the amount of the net debt of the municipality outstanding, authorized or to be authorized, as shown by said statement, including this issue, is \$237,266.00.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Dunn at an election as provided under said act.

NOTE: Under Section 20 of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 178, Public Laws of 1919) this ordinance, after passage, shall be published once each week for four successive weeks in a newspaper published in the Town of Dunn, and at the end of the ordinance so published the following notice must be added, with blanks properly filled in, and the printed signature of the Clerk appended to the notice:

BROAD MOVEMENT IN STAPLE COTTONS

Retailers are buying staple cotton goods steadily, the demand for domestics of standard grades being unusually broad, although the takings are in small lots. Sheets and pillow cases are exceptionally well conditioned. Brown sheetings are lower, and weakness has developed in some lines of bleached muslins and other plain bleached fabrics. Narrow prints and percales continue in steady demand for small lots. Efforts are being made in some quarters to clean up stocks of napped goods. Wash fabrics in printed and woven lines are being bought by small lots for quick shipment. The demand for unfinished goods for general manufacturing and converting purposes has continued light.
