PARDONS ARE ASKED FOR THE ALLEN CLAN

Pardons Reported To Have 60,000 Signatures, Are Filed With Governor
Richmond, Va., Sept. 24. — Petitions which it was claimed carried 60,000 signatures were presented to Governor E. Lee Trinkle here this afternoon by a delegation of prominent men and women from many parts of the state who are seeking pardons for Sidney and Friel Allen, and Wesley and Sidna Edwards, now serving sentences in the state penitentiary here for participation in the Hillside courthouse shooting, March 14, 1912, which Judge T. L. Mann, Commonwealth's Attorney W. M. Foster and three other persons were killed.

Senator New Returns Beveridge Silence for Silence.
Republicans of Indiana have opened the Congressional campaign with the determination to make a vigorous fight against one another.

Senator New, who was defeated for re-election by Albert J. Beveridge, has begun the fight. He has flouted Beveridge and Beveridge's following by announcing that he will not make any speeches for his successful opponent in the recent Republican primary.

Clarence B. Martin, who managed Beveridge's campaign before the primary and who is now head of the Republican headquarters bureau in Indianapolis, inquired of Senator New about his itinerary during the coming campaign. The latter replied: "My itinerary will be easy to arrange, since I will follow the same route as that of Beveridge in 1916."

At this time there was an effort to make it appear that the story of New's refusal to make at least an over-the-

contribution to Beveridge's candidacy was a fabrication. But New has confirmed it.
"I am not going to make any speeches in the campaign," he said when interviewed in Washington by the correspondent of the New York Times.
