DOCTOR SAYS MRS. VONCANNON WILL RECOVER

Mrs. Lucille Voncannon, wife of Frank Voncannon, was shot in the back part of her head as she sat in the back seat of the Rockefeller hunting party on Saturday night between 7 and 8 o'clock. She is now in care of Dr. Holt in Duke hospital where she was taken Monday by Dr. J. W. Phillips, the attending physician. Dr. Phillips states that the woman's wound is painful though not necessarily fatal. He thinks she will recover.

Mr. Voncannon's statement is that she was at her home Saturday afternoon and that her husband was at M. J. Smith's holding with hog killing. She states that Frank Trulove came to her home and tried to induce her to run away with him. She says that she refused and he left. In a few minutes Archie McRae came and sat down and was talking to the children, of whom there are four, ranging in age from about 3 to 10 years.

Mr. McRae had been in the house only about five minutes when a shot rang out and he discovered that Mrs. Voncannon was wounded. It seems that the shot was fired through a small crack in the house, the point of the pistol being a very short distance from the woman's head. The bullet, a .32 calibre, entered just behind the right ear and drove through the back of the head coming out below the left ear.

In her statement Mrs. Voncannon, who has been conscious all the while, strongly intimates her belief that Frank Trulove did the shooting. Her husband's statements, according to the same intimation, Trulove has not been taken in custody. Sheriff McArtan was unable to find him when he went to the scene of the shooting and it is rumored that he has fled the country.

There is a sordid story connected with the affair which is so revolting in its details that it is unfit to print. The woman herself confessed to the officials, so it is stated, that she had not been living virtuously and was then in a delicate state. She stated that the man whom she believes shot her was responsible for her condition.

Quite a little excitement was aroused when news of the shooting reached Lillington. Rumor mingled with unfounded stories of the affair made out that the Ku Klux were again on a rampage and that they had shot a woman and the whole section of Harsett lying next to Cumberland was shouting for help. These rumors spread thick and fast till the officers brought in the true story of the shooting as far as they had been able to learn it at its base.
