Host Charles Ress is in receipt of the following letter from Commissioner Jno. Sprunt Hill which appeared in Thursday's Harnett County News:

Durham, Jan. 31, 1923.

My Dear Mr. Ross: I beg to acknowiedge receipt of your favor of January 29. You can assure our friends in Harnett county that the interests of that county are not being neglected by the Commissioner from the Fourth District. On the contrary, I have, from the beginning, made special effort to push the road building in Harnett county even faster than some other cases because of the splendid spirit shown by Harnett county in lending the state money to build roads when it was difficult for the state to secure funds. You are aware, of course, that 21.9 miles of the best gravel road in the state, at a cost of over \$200,000, has already constructed by the State Highway Commission in Harnett county, and no expense was spared in making this road from Wake county line to Cumberland county line the "best gravel road in the state."




