

**EXPECT TO OPEN HOSPITAL MAY 1**

Equipment Now Being Installed in The Tart Building on South Magnolia Ave.

Equipment for the Dunn hospital has arrived, and is being installed in the L. A. Tart building, South Magnolia avenue. It is expected that the hospital will be opened May 1, according to Dr. W. E. Coltrane. A new room with southern exposure for the operating department will be added, material for same having already been purchased. A part of the nurses have already been employed. As has been stated in The Dispatch, ten wards, with provision for twenty beds, will be equipped and the new hospital will be fitted with the latest and best sterilizers and other necessary fixtures. Drs. W. E. Coltrane, I. F. Hicks, H. C. Turlington and E. L. Warren, all of Dunn, are behind the project, and the new hospital will be in keeping with the needs of the town in the way of hospital advantages.

**ADMITS MURDER DOWNS HALF A CENTURY AGO**

Having kept his dark secret for half a century, a man who confessed to being a North Carolinian and a murderer whose crime was committed soon after the end of the Civil war killed in Natchez, Miss., Monday, according to a letter from Captain C. L. Stearnes of the Salvation Army in Natchez, to Secretary of State W. N. Everett, of North Carolina. The Salvation Army officer requests that the records be searched but there is little likelihood that the obscure records of the period, incomplete as they are now, will ever yield up anything to clear the mystery of a murder committed in the sixties by a man whose first two names were Sam Lee.

The letter from the Salvation Army officer follows:

"I am writing you in regard to an elderly man from somewhere in North Carolina who has been giving his name as Sam Lee. This man, I understand, has been wanted for

Definite account of the tragedy is not available, but it is stated that Owens was pranking with Peterson and made out that he would cut him and did slightly cut him. Peterson was angered and got a stick after Owens and in the scuffle Owens got the stick away from Peterson and cut him fatally.
