

**To The Young Men  
Of Sampson County**

The War Department, under the National Defense Act, offers young men between the age of 17 and 24 thirty days out in citizens military training camps, from August 1st to 30th, 1923.

The object of these camps is to bring together young men of high type from all sections of the county on a common basis of equality and under the most favorable conditions of outdoor life; to stimulate and promote citizenship, patriotism and Americanism; and, through expert physical direction, athletic coaching and military training, to benefit the young men individually and bring them to realize their obligation to their country.

These camps are to be held at Camp McClellan, Ala. (near Anniston) and Fort Barrancas, Fla. (near Pensacola) during the time stated above.

I have been appointed county chairman for the citizens military training camp work for sampson county, and will be glad to give such information as I may have to persons who are interested. The Government pays the expenses of those attending, including transportation to an from camp, uniforms, food and medical attendance.

payments from foreign debtors. As even more striking feature of the March trade reports is the fact that the month actually produced an excess of imports over exports amounting to \$61,000,000. While this is also regarded as a natural outcome of our position as a creditor nation and of our foreign policies, it is thought that the decline in exports has been emphasized by the Ruhr crisis, which has checked the industrial revival in Europe and diminished that continent's ability to buy foodstuff and raw materials.
