

SEVERE DECLINES IN COTTON PRICES

New Orleans Market Closes The Week 122 to 187 Points Not Lower

New Orleans, June 3.—Trading in cotton last week was done on a long decline, highest prices being made on the opening session, while lowest December prices were reached on the closing session.

For the decline a somewhat more favorable opinion of crop prospects than had been entertained was mainly responsible, this opinion being strengthened by the government's first condition figures for the season, 71.0 per cent of normal, issued late in the week.

The effect of the condition figures was heightened by the return toward the end of the week, of dry weather to the eastern belt, by less rainfall in Arkansas and Oklahoma, and by showers over some sections of Texas, the only stated belt to really need rain.
