

HOG CHOLERA IS SPREADING AGAIN

Dreaded Disease of Swine Is Raging in Vicinity Near Coats

Hog cholera, that dread disease of swine, has again made its appearance in Harnett county, apparently following the importation of some feeding and breeding animals, and is now raging in the vicinity south-west of Coats, where it has already killed several hundred dollars worth of hogs, and apparently is destined to kill many more unless prompt action is taken to prevent further spread.

Dr. Owen, placed in the state to assist the local authorities in combating this disease, has done a great deal of work in Harnett county this year, and for a time it appeared that the disease had been fought to a stand-still, and such probably would have been the case if it were not for the fact that the disease apparently, had been imported into native county herds.

However, by prompt work, he and county demonstration agent, Mr. H. A. Edge, hopes to confine the present outbreak to a small section, and to save as many animals in the infected district as possible.

To that end, these gentlemen are arranging to hold a meeting at the Turlington school house on Monday night, November 19th, at 7:30, to discuss with the farmers of that neighborhood the measures which should be taken to stamp out the disease, and it is hoped that every one in that portion of the county will go out to hear what they have to say.

At this meeting arrangements will be made to inoculate the hogs of any one desiring this work to be done, the cost of which will only be for the material used, and which ranges from about 25 cents per pig, up to about \$1.25 for large hogs. Dr. Owen, however, insists that as there will no doubt be a great deal of work to be done, neither he nor Mr. Edge will have time to go to the farms of any one who does not attend the meeting and there give in his list of hogs which he desires to have vaccinated.
