

Good Crops in N. C.

(From Manufacturers Bureau)
The North Carolina Cooperative Crop Reporting Service states that this year's crop of corn, estimated to be 535,000 bushels, is the largest since 1912, with an average yield of 22 1-2 bushels per acre as compared with 20 bushels for the ten year average. This indicates that North Carolina farmers are getting better results in yield per acre in their corn, and that is true of many other North Carolina products.

The North Carolina wheat crop of 6,630,000 bushels is the largest since 1920.

The cotton crop is estimated, including the value of seed, at \$174,000,000, or 40 per cent more than last year's value, and more than 100 per cent in excess of the value of 1920 and 1921 crop.

North Carolina is fortunate in addition to its main staples of cotton, corn and tobacco—and the tobacco crop of 257,000,000 pounds is 25 per cent above last year's crop—in having a very wide diversity of agricultural products which largely add to the income of the farmers of the state. The Agricultural Statistician of the Cooperative Crop Reporting Service adds:

"With the fine diversification of North Carolina's crops, and especially the cash crops so well distributed over the state, we are particularly fortunate in the agricultural interests this year."

Smothered To Death In Pile Of Loose Cotton

Salisbury, Dec. 2.—Olin Gilmer Silliman, 10-year-old son of Jas. D. Silliman, of Millbridge, met a tragic death Saturday afternoon when he smothered to death in a pile of loose cotton. The little fellow was playing about the house and in some way got in the pile of cotton and smothered to death before his perilous condition was discovered. The funeral was held today and interment was at Tyrrell.

Williams, Chief of Division of Agronomy, gives the best fertilizer mixtures for the leading crops of this State, together with the type of soils on which these mixtures give best results. It is believed by the agronomy workers that farmers of North Carolina will find in these recommendations those formulas which will suit every need and will give biggest returns when used. These recommendations are based on many years of fertility research and are therefore authoritative.

Irish potatoes, Coastal Plain Region, sandy loam soils, mixture 6-7-5.
Truck crops, Coastal Plain Region, sandy or sandy loam soils, mixture 7-5-5.

Tobacco, Coastal Plain Region, rather sandy but containing moderate amounts of organic matter, mixture 3-3-5.

Tobacco, Coastal Plain Region, sandy loam soil, mixture 6-4-4.

Sweet potatoes, Coastal Plain Region, sandy or sandy loam soil, mixture 3-4-4.

Corn, cotton and small grains, Coastal Plain Region, sandy loam soil, mixture 3-3-3.

Legumes, Piedmont and Mountain Regions, loam soil, mixture 10-2-4.
Cotton, Piedmont Region, clay and clay loam soil, mixture 10-4-2.

Tobacco, Piedmont and Mountain Regions, sandy loam soils, mixture 10-4-4.

Truck crops, Piedmont and Mountain Regions, clay and clay loam soil, mixture 10-5-3.

Legumes, Piedmont and Mountain Regions, good clay loam soils, containing a moderate amount of organic matter, mixture 12-0-4.

Cotton, Piedmont Region, light silty, clay loam soils, containing

moderate amount of organic matter, mixture 12-5-3.

On the greater part of a large section of some soluble form of ammonia will frequently be applied for best paying results when this mixture is used in the soil at planting time.

In the mixtures given above, the first figure in the last column is percentage of available phosphoric acid; the second, ammonia; and the third, potash.

The fertilizer formulas given above are recommended by the Division of Agronomy of the N. C. Experiment Station, State College Raleigh, N. C., for use by North Carolina farmers for the year 1924. They were agreed upon for average soil conditions by the official workers of North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia in a conference held in Atlanta, Ga., on October 16, 1923, after a thorough consideration of the findings of carefully conducted field experiments through a number of years in the three states.
