**Planning Campaign
For Christian College**

Wilson, Dec. 6.—Carrying out the policy adopted by the Disciples of Christ at the North Carolina State Convention held in Raleigh last month, which provides for the maintenance of the Atlantic Christian College, located at Wilson, as a standard senior college, George Hackney, chairman of the Board of Trustees has appointed a Steering Committee to work out the details of a \$300,000 campaign to be launched about the first of next January.

Composing this committee are: J. W. Hines, of Rocky Mount; Chairman; George Hackney, of Wilson; H. Galt Braxton and C. W. Howard, of Kingston, and L. W. Chapman, of Grifton.

A meeting will be held in Wilson sometime next week for the purpose of formulating plans or the coming campaign. The proceeds of the drive will be used chiefly in the construction of additional dormitories a gymnasium and a central heating system.
