Some Precincts In County Vote Eight To One Against Repeal Light Vote

Keeping in line with the remainder of the state the voters of Haywood county Tuesday voted two to one against repeal of the eighteenth amendment with a total vote of 3904 against repeal and 1956 for repeal. The votes for convention were 2035 and votes on no convention 3522.

Only two precincts of the 20 in the county gave the repealists the majority—South Waynesville and Beaverdam number 6. The Beaverdam number 6 precinct gave Dr. E. M. Davis, repeal candidate an 8 majority over James Atkins, Jr., dry candidate.

Repealists in Big Creek battled to a 14 to 11 vote all the way through. The largest majorities polled by the drys in any precinct were at Ivy Hill and Clyde each carrying the vote by almost 8 to 1.
