Dr. Robert H. Stretcher attended the clinic held at the Duke University Hospital on Saturday and also took in the football game.

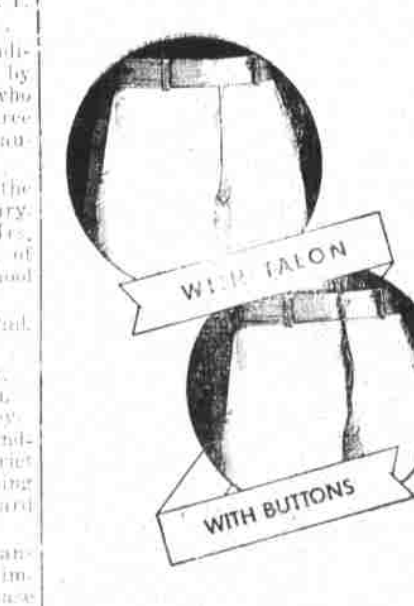
