BRIDGEPORT, Conn.—Charging non-payment of his bill for professional services rendered the late Percy A. Rockefeller of Greenwich, wealthy nephew of John D. Rockefeller, oil magnate, Dr. Harry M. Goehring of Pittsburgh, Pa., nationally famous osteopathic physician, filed suit in the Supreme Court against Rockefeller's estate for \$60,000.

**Last Rites Held For J. R. Byrd, 56, On Sat. Afternoon**

Last rites for J. R. Byrd, 56, who died at his home in Hazelwood at 1:30 o'clock Friday morning were conducted at the home Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The Rev. C. L. Allen and the Rev. J. M. Woodard officiated. Interment was made in Green Hill cemetery, Waynesville.

Mr. Byrd's death was due to pneumonia, but he had been in poor health several years. He retired from his work at the O. C. Lawrence Leather Company due to ill health 12 years ago.

Besides his widow, Mr. Byrd is survived by the following children: Harold, Frank, Louie, Earl, Edith, and Mrs. Ellis Sorrells, of Hazelwood, and Edward and Fred, of Lenoir. Twelve grand children, one brother, John Byrd, of Candler, and five sisters, Mrs. Horace McCall, Swannanoa, Mrs. W. M. Hall, Greenville, S. C., Mrs. John Tritt, Cullowhee, and Mrs. Thud Keller, and Mrs. Arthur Robinson, of Washington state, also survive.

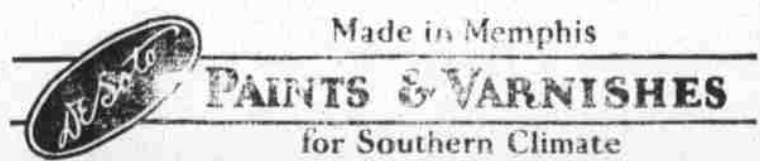
