Tomato Plants For Use In Cannery Will Soon Be Ready

T. H. Rogers, field manager of the Haywood County Mutual Canning Association, announced this week that farmers who have signed up for acre-age for tomatoes would receive no-tice soon that half of the plants were ready for planting. He advised getting the land in proper condition.

He said: "Broadcast fifty per cent of the fertilizer and work well into the soil. Put the oth r fifty per cent in the hill. A 5 7-5 fertilizer at the rate of 600 to 800 pourds per acre will give good results."

He suggested that the plants should be set deep to encourage a heavy root system. This is essential in supporting a large plant with a heavy crop of fruit.
