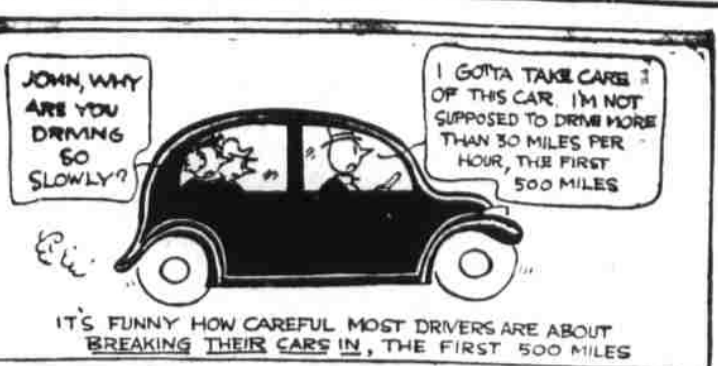

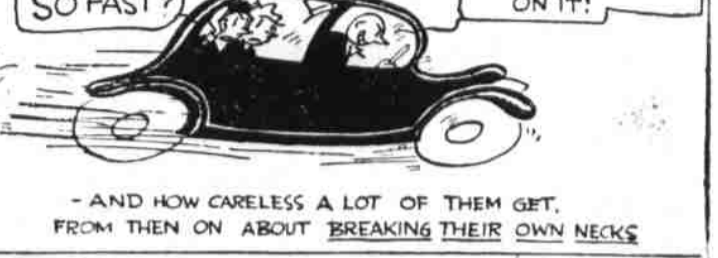

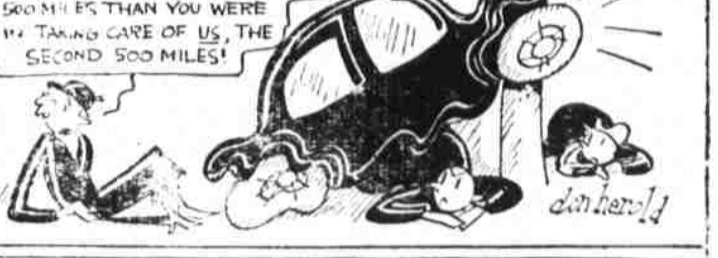
**The First 500 Miles Are the Saneest**

Nine out of every ten automobile accidents which in 1934 involved driving errors resulted from too much speed. It is shown by reports compiled by the Travelers Insurance Company. This fact is brought out in various ways by the statistics on automobile accidents among which are these:

The rate of death in 1934 per accident on highways was more than 199 per cent greater than the average for all accidents combined. This shows that the highway is no place for a driver to be "asleep at the switch."

The rate of death per accident on curves was 131 per cent worse last year than the average for all accidents combined. The question has been asked, "what does the driver think about when he goes around a curve too fast or on the wrong side of the road?"

Government mortality statistics show that the rate of death from automobile accidents continues to mount faster in rural territories than in urban districts. In 1933, the latest year that such statistics are available, the death rate from automobile accidents increased 64 per cent compared to 1932. In urban districts it increased 45 per cent, while in rural territories it increased 101 per cent. From 1923 to 1933 inclusive, the total death rate from automobile accidents increased 58.7 per cent, although in urban districts it increased only 32.8 per cent. In rural territories, however, the rate of death jumped 101.9 per cent.

Many motorists fail to appreciate the fact that "the person who always drives at a reasonable rate of speed, saves gasoline, trouble, money and human life." Don Herold in his cartoon above hits the nail on the head. He wonders why drivers usually are so careful breaking in new cars but are so careless with their own lives and the lives of others just as soon as the "breaking-in" distance has been traveled.

**COUNTY AGENT W. D. SMITH'S column**

Our trucking program is going along nicely. Mr. Rogers is working hard in his effort to get around to everyone who has a contract, but it will be impossible for him to get to every place in time to help you with your problems. Last winter when we talked the matter of vegetable growing over with you we stated that it would be necessary during the summer to meet in groups in the fields. Within the next few days we expect to start these meetings and demonstrate how to spray to destroy the bean beetle and control the blight of tomatoes. If you have not already done so, get on hand Magnesium Arsenate for bean beetles and Bordeaux Mixture for tomatoes. Be ready when these things are needed. The bugs and disease do not wait for you to get ready. Try working your vegetables when the dew is off. Plan to do other work when your vegetables are wet. Our trucking program, to be a success, must have cooperation all the way through. How about using some of your old tobacco stalks to stake your tomatoes, or if you are not going to stake them, how about using some old rye or wheat straw to mulch the ground under your plants after the last cultivation and pull out what weeds come through the straw later? These things have been found to be worth while by good truckers.

Mr. H. R. Niswanger found it impossible to be in Haywood county at this time. He expects to be here sometime during the month of June. He is on a big job now with the farmers in Burke and McDowell counties, marketing Red Latham raspberries. Any farmer who wishes to get into the berry growing game should give careful consideration. We have some rich possibilities here, and the

County Agent will be glad to talk the matter over with those who are determined to get into the berry growing game and stay.

**WHEN DOES RURAL HAYWOOD COUNTY GET ELECTRICITY?**

This question is being continually asked by the farmers of Haywood county. They want electricity for their homes and at a price they can pay. More and more people are saying we have all the energy that coming generations will ever need in our streams, if we can only find a way to gear it up and put it to serving us. The farmers are perfectly willing to pay for what they use, but they are not willing to pay enormous profits to selfish interests. The question is frequently asked, what is the justice in closely built communities getting the benefits of electricity when the rural areas are ignored? If the power companies will not serve rural America then why allow them to block the efforts of others who will work it out so that our rural people can have the blessings of electricity? Why not have cooperation of the towns and rural communities in working out this problem? Why is it that Haywood county has one of the greatest power plants within its borders and high tension lines run diagonally across the county and only one rural line? This condition has existed for six years. How much longer are those responsible for this condition going to allow it to continue?
