Last winter when we alked the matter of vegetable growing over with you we stated that it would be necessary during the summer to meet in groups in the fields. Within the next few days we expect to start these meetings and demon-state how to spray to destroy the bean beetle and control the slight of innatoes. If you have not already done so, get on hand Magnesium Ar-schate for bean beetles and Bordeaux Mixture for tomatoes. Be ready when these things are needed. The bugs and disease do not wait for you o get ready. Try working your vegetables when the dew is off. Plan a do other work when your vegeta bles are wet. Our trucking program, by a success, must have cooperaion all the way through. How about using some of your old tobacco stalks to stake your tomatoes, or if you are int going to stake them, how about using some old rye or wheat straw o mulch the ground under your plants after the last cultivation and pull out what weeds come through the straw later?
